A Day for the Maximum Decibels

Today's televised 16-hour assault on eardrums across the globe from Wembley and Philadelphia is not only unquestionably well meant and well timed but also highly appropriate for its decibel level. In a world increasingly equipped with instant means of communicating information, propaganda and entertainment it becomes harder and harder to get attention and well nigh impossible to keep it. Millions of people round the world will find it difficult not to notice today's unprecedented telethon, and with luck it will cause another tidal wave of generosity. But the hunger which immediately menaces half the continent is only one aspect, albeit the most obviously horrific, of Africa's multiple crises, which has become a gigantic vicious circle. As we reported on Thursday, relief workers are becoming increasingly angry and frustrated because aid which is only case inadequate is also held up by logistical problems. Bad
